- Maintain regular, effective communication with Crew Leaders and crew; engage with feedback to help set goals, assess growth, and celebrate progress
- Challenge yourself to engage in new experiences and ideas; participate fully in all crew activities
- Support an emotionally and physically safe crew environment
- Follow VYCC policies and procedures including the rapidly evolving COVID-19 protocols

Required Qualifications

- Be 15-17 years old at the start of the position

About The Vermont Youth Conservation Corps (VYCC)

The VYCC is a 501c3 nonprofit focused on engaging young people in service, work, conservation, and agriculture. Since 1985, VYCC staff have provided valuable work and learning opportunities to youth and young adults from across the country and from nearly every town in Vermont. Our model is strong and simple: young people, working together, guided by highly trained leaders, completing priority projects in conservation and agriculture.

VYCC Food and Farm Program Overview

VYCC's Food and Farm Program engages young people in diversified, sustainable agriculture, culinary education, and community food security work on our campus in Richmond, Vermont. We grow organically certified vegetables and pasture raised chickens for our nationally recognized Health Care Share project, which connects Vermont families who experience barriers to accessing locally grown produce or have diet-related disease with a weekly vegetable share in partnership with medical centers. We also raise layer hens for eggs, pigs for meat and additional vegetables, flowers and herbs that we sell through our vibrant, on-site farm stand. Crew Leaders are essential to the success of the Health Care Share and the daily operations of the farm.

VYCC Conservation Program Overview

VYCC's Conservation Program engages young people in hands-on projects that benefit Vermont's environment and communities. The work of a Conservation Crew includes trail construction and maintenance, carpentry, water quality improvement, and forest management. Conservation Camping Crews tackle projects all across Vermont, moving from one project to another as they work and live together as a group for weeks at a time. Conservation Day Crews are rooted in a community – either Richmond or Woodstock for 2021 – and work but do not live together as a group. Conservation Crew Leaders are essential to the success of any Conservation Crew and their efforts have a significant impact on habitat, water quality, and outdoor recreation in Vermont.
