Choose the type of impact you want to make and we'll match your sponsorship to VYCC crews completing high priority work in your choice of: <u>trails</u>, <u>water quality</u>, <u>forest health</u>, or <u>build</u> (carpentry in outdoor recreation infrastructure).

Who and what are you sponsoring?

- Young adults from Vermont and beyond, working in teams of 2-10. A VYCC experience provides career pathways while building leadership skills, confidence, teamwork, and community. Corps Members emerge from VYCC as future community, environmental, and business leaders.
- The projects VYCC crews tackle have deep, lasting impacts on Vermont's natural resources, outdoor recreation, and the health of our communities.

When and where is your sponsorship?

- > Your sponsorship lasts for the entire length of VYCC's conservation work season April to November.
- Crews are positioned in a variety of locations all over Vermont, including state parks, national forests, public roads, popular hiking trails and waterways, backcountry trails/huts, and campgrounds.
- As projects and crews shift throughout the season, we will ensure your sponsorship is continuously aligned with a crew completing projects from the project area you chose.
